

## Park House Sensory Garden 30th Anniversary

## What to look out for in June

If you want to know the names of the lovely blooms in Park House Sensory Garden, here are tips and photos shared by Mark Baldwin, the gardener. Additional photos marked with an \* are kindly provided by Ian Nicol who is recording the garden for us this year.

1. Broom (Cytisus), shrub with red flowers next to the conservatory.



2. Viburnum plicatum f. tomentosum, adjacent to the Wisteria seat.



3. Sweet Cicely (Myrrhis odorata), Aniseed scented perennial with white umbellifer flowers. (Hurry - the flowers are just going over).



4. Allium Purple Sensation, just coming into bloom. Mostly in the entrance beds and the central Box bed with the Cherry Tree. Purple Sensation will soon be followed by the larger Allium Cristophii, which is throughout the garden.



5. Sweet Rocket (Hesperis matronalis), fragrant purple flowers in the entrance beds. Hesperis matronalis alba, white flowers in the central Box bed with the Cherry Tree and the Box bed nearest the conservatory.





6. Lupins, in the Box bed behind the bench with yellow roses.







8. Solomon's Seal (Polygonatum x hybridum). Beneath the Cherry Tree.
