Both birds are from the thrush family so they look very similar. Can you spot what makes them different?

Fieldfares and Redwings are our winter visitors from Northern Europe and fly to the UK in search of a warmer climate.

Hawthorn berries are their favourite.

Black Stripe above eye.

Silver head

Black Feet.

Fieldfares and Redwings feast on berry laden hedges in open grasslands like farms and parks. In severe winters they can be seen in gardens, searching for food.

Pale brown Stripe above eye.

REDWING

Rusty Red underwing.

Both birds are in global decline. Breeding pairs in the UK are extremely low due to climate change and habitat loss.

Help Redwings and Fieldfares this winter by leaving apple slices in your garden or even consider planting Hawthorn, Holly or a Dog-rose hedge.
